The *Dry-Cleaning Solvent Cleanup Act* (DSCA) Program is now accepting applications from drycleaners and others whose responsibilities include cleanup of environmental contamination at drycleaning sites. The DSCA Program provides a special trust fund to pay a portion of the costly cleanup activities at contaminated sites when the N.C. Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) requires such cleanup. In order to be eligible for participation in this program, drycleaners must comply with the Perchloroethylene (PERC) NESHAP regulations as well as implement other management practices.

NESHAP stands for National Emissions Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants. It is a federal rule aimed at reducing toxics emissions such as PERC from drycleaners. The regulations require drycleaners to regularly check for leaks, maintain records and in some cases operate pollution control equipment.

The NC *Division of Air Quality* (DAQ) has many compliance tools and other useful information that can help PERC drycleaners comply with the NESHAP. We need your assistance in identifying which drycleaners are subject to the NESHAP so that we can provide you with this helpful compliance information. Therefore, under the authority of 15A NC AC 2D. 0202 "Registration of Air Pollution Sources," we are requiring that all drycleaning facilities in North Carolina complete and return the attached postage-paid registration card to us within sixty (60) days of receiving this card.

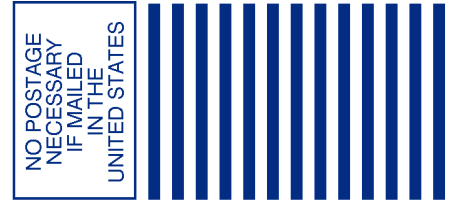
