RECOMMENDATION and COMMENT Issue Permit # 04090T19			FEE CLASS Title V	

1. Purpose of Application

This revision is a renewal of an existing Title V permit pursuant to 2Q .0513. The existing Title V permit was issued on July 1, 1999 and is currently scheduled to expire on May 30, 2003. The renewal application was received on August 30, 2002 or at least nine months prior to the expiration date. Therefore, the existing permit shall not expire until the renewal permit has been issued or denied. All terms and conditions of the existing permit shall remain in effect until the renewal permit has been issued or denied.

2. Facility Description

This facility is engaged in food processing and manufactures canned soup from bulk food materials.

3. Application Chronology

August 30, 2002 - Air permit application was received by the Division of Air Quality (DAQ), Fayetteville Regional Office. Permit application was considered complete as of August 30, 2002.

October 9, 2002 - Air permit application was received by the Division of Air Quality (DAQ), Raleigh Central Office.

February 14, 2003 - Regional review received from Tom MsKinney.

4. Permit Modification/Changes

There have been no Section 502(b)(10) changes made to the initial Title V permit since its issuance. Changes to the permit will consist of correcting all reporting dates to July 30 and Jan 30 and updating the general conditions.

The following table represents the changes to the current Title V permit:

5. Regulatory Review

The facility is subject to the following regulations:

- 2D .0503 "Particulates from Fuel Burning Indirect Heat Exchangers"
- 2D .0516 "Sulfur Dioxide Emissions from Combustion Sources"
- 2D .0521 "Control Of Visible Emissions"
- 2D .0530 "Prevention of Significant Deterioration" (AVOIDANCE)
- 2D .1100 "Control of Toxic Air Pollutants "

However, no regulatory review is required at this time since there are no new applicable regulations for this permit revision (renewal).

6. NSPS, NESHAPS, PSD, Attainment Status, 112(r), CAM

NSPS

New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) do not apply to this facility.

NESHAP/MACT

This facility is not currently subject to any National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP).

PSD

This facility is not a major Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) source.

Attainment Status

This facility is located in Robeson County which is in attainment according to 2D .0902.

112(r)

This facility is subject to Section 112(r) of the Clean Air Act requirements because it stores anhydrous ammonia.

CAM

Compliance Assurance Monitoring (CAM) (40 CFR Part 64) does not apply.

7. Facility Wide Air Toxics

The facility must comply with the emission limitations and other requirements of 2D .1100 for emissions of formaldehyde.

8. Facility Compliance Status

The facility was inspected on August 7, 2002 by Mitch Revels, FRO. The facility was considered to be in compliance at that time. An NOV was subsequently issued for the submittal of a late report.

9. Statement of Compliance

The DAQ has reviewed the compliance status of this facility. Based on the latest inspection, the facility was in compliance with all applicable requirements. The applicant has certified that the facility will be in compliance with all applicable requirements at the time of permit issuance and will continue to comply with these requirements. The applicant has also certified that the facility will be in compliance with any applicable requirements taking effect during the term of the permit and will meet such requirements on a timely basis.

10. Facility Emissions Review

There is no change in emissions for this renewal.

11. Stipulation Review

All stipulations are standard for this type of facility and no changes other than those specified in the table above are required.

12. Public Notice / EPA and Affected State Review

Pursuant to 2Q. 0521, a notice of the draft Title V Permit shall be placed in a newspaper of general circulation in the area where the facility is located. The notice will provide for a 30 day comment period, with an

opportunity for a public hearing. Copies of the public notice shall be sent to persons on the Title V mailing list and EPA. Pursuant to 2Q .0522, a copy of each permit application, each proposed permit and each final permit pursuant shall be provided to EPA. Also pursuant to 2Q .0522, a notice of the draft Title V Permit shall be provided to each affected State at or before the time notice provided to the public under 2Q .0521 above. South Carolina is the only affected State for this facility.

13. Conclusions, Comments, and Recommendations

A professional engineer's seal was not required for this renewal.

A consistency determination was not required for this renewal.

FRO recommends issuance of the permit per Tom McKinney's review received February 14, 2003.

RCO concurs with FRO's recommendation to issue air permit.
